KEYSTONE PATRONS.

Grange Work In Pennsylvania Out-

State Master Hill at the thirtieth annual session of the Pennsylvania state grange made a strong plea for co-operation of granges with the agricultural colleges and experiment stations and urged a general display of the products of the state at the world's fair, St. Louis, in 1904.

Referring to the vexed taxation question, State Master Hill stated that the personal property of his state is valued at \$3,859,500,000 and pays taxes aggregating \$12,132,500, making a mileage rate of 314 mills. Real estate has a val-uation of \$2,776,800,000 and for the same period pays taxes amounting to \$48,783,500, or an average mileage rate of a little over 17 mills. The contrast is striking. Everything the farmer has in sight is taxed as real estate.

Patrons feel that better roads cannot come too soon provided that the burden of building and maintaining is not, as in the past thrown upon farmers. We have for years stood ready to join forces on a fair basis with the other interests of the state in securing them.

Patrons vere urged to make more

general use of banks for the deposit of their mone; and to use checks as a me-dium for naking payments. A bank account gives farmers standing. It is a great inspiration to keep it good and to make it larger. It develops business acumen and often saves money. A larger use of enecks would save farmers thousands of dollars in the one item of sending money by mail.—American Ag-


