Every advertiser should keep close watch of his daily and weekly sales. He should make a schedule of last year's sales, by days, weeks and months, and enter against it


each day's sales for this year, as they are ascertained.



#### INSTRUCTORS.


Prof. J. E. R. Hillgore will instruct in English, History, and Civics. Prof. E. F. Hill will instruct in Mathematics.
