The meetings should promote social and fraternal greetings and extend the acquaintance of members and others, with all the good people in a radius of twenty or twenty-five miles of each meeting. To secure large attendance and the best people, system must be employed. The Pomona, or subordinate, grange having the meeting in charge should appoint active and energetic committees—first, on programme; second, on arrange-ments and grounds; third, on music; fourth, on advertising, invitation and

printing; fifth, on reception.

Every detail of the meeting should be thought out and provision made to make the meeting pleasing, entertaining, enjoyable and profitable to all who may attend. If the committee on invitation should have printed a circular letter cordially inviting those to whom it may be addressed and their families to attend and mail or deliver to every family whom you would like to be pres ent it would add largely to the at-

tendance. Large supplies of grange literature should be judiciously distributed with the letters of invitation and at the meet ings. This will afford members an op-portunity to inquire after the meeting as to the impressions made by the literature or at the meeting and secure good many applications. Patrons of Husbandry should remember when those not members of the Order are favorably impressed with the objects purposes and work of the Order it is a good time to secure their active co-operation and membership.




