### Treasurer's Sale of Seated and Unseated Lands.

According to the provisions of an Act of Assembly entitled, "An Act directing the mode of selling Unseated Lands for taxes, passed the 20th day of March, 1815, and the supplements thereto, I, LEE R. GAVITT, Treasurer of this county of Sullivan, hereby give notice to all persons concerned that unless the county, State, Road School and Poor Taxes due on the following tracts on Unseated Lands situated in said county and paid before the day of sale, the whole or such part of each tract as will pay the taxes and such other charges thereon will be sold at the Court House in Laporte, said county of Sullivan on the 14th day of June, 1904, being the second Monday of June. The sale to be continued by adjournment from day to day if deemed necessary for arrears of taxes due, and assessed and cost accrued on each tract respectively.
