Agreeable to the provisions of an Act of Assem-  
bly entitled, "An Act directing the mode of sell-  
ing Unseated Lands for taxes, passed the 20th day  
of March, 1816, and the supplements thereto, I,  
LEE R. GAVITT Treasurer of the County of Sulli-  
van, hereby give notice to all persons concerned  
that unless the County, State, Road, School and  
Poor Taxes due on the following tracts on Un-  
seated Lands situated in said county and paid  
before the day of sale, the whole or such part  
of each tract as will pay the taxes and such cost  
chargeable thereon will be sold at the Court House  
in Laporte, said county of Sullivan on the 13th  
day of June, 1904, being the second Monday of  
June. The sale to be continued by adjournment  
from day to day, if deemed necessary for arrears  
of taxes due, and assessed and cost accrued  
on each tract respectively.
