If nobody had ever put up a sign, one baking powder company would not now



The trouble is that you can't repeat the operation often enough-personally. What you can do is to put the card and the remark. more or less elaborately expressed, into such a paper



An advertisement in the newspaper is a little thing, but it goes into thousands of homes and tells thousands of people just what you most wish them


