GAVITT Treasurer of the County of Sullivan, hereby give notice to all persons concerned that unless the County State, Road, School and Poor Taxes due on the following tracts on Unseated Lands situated in said county and paid before the day of sale, the whole or such part of each tract as will pay the taxes and such cost enforceable thereon will be sold at the Court House in Laporte, said county of Sullivan on the 19th day of June, 1904, being the second Monday of June. The sale to be continued by adjournment from day to day if deemed necessary for arrears of taxes due, and assessed and cost accrued on each tract respectively.
