Pluralties. Tremendous Elect by The People

A Republican Landslide Sweeps the Nation From the Atlantic to the Pacific, Carrying With it All the Doubtful States.

BREAKS ALL RECORDS.

Great Triumphs of the Party Achieved by McKinley Surpassed by the Tremendous Victory Won on Tuesday by the Leadership of Rooscvelt.

PARKER THE WORST BEATEN CANDIDATE SINCE GREELEY

Democratic Pluralities Throughout the South Cut Down.

A political landslide which surpasses anything in the nation's history with the possible exception of the overwhelming defeat of Greeley and Grant in 1872, brought victory to Roosevelt and Fairbanks.

With Maryland in the Republican column, Roosevelt has 325 electoral votes and Parker 151. Democracy's strength is thus reduced to the solid South. The entire North and West has rendered a mighty verdict of confidence in President Roosevelt.

In addition to the Nation's indorsement of the Republican Adminis tration, the hands of the President have been strengthen by an increased Republican majority in Congress.
