Manufacturers and the emplayees of manufacturers, deprived of protection unfairly, will naturally join the free traders, and the whole fabric will fall—at least until we have learned another lesson like of 1893.

Men and brethren, this Canadian reciprocity, like the tariff reform and free raw materials of 1892, is simply a move the part of the enemy to divide protectionists so that they may be beaten letail. 
