Increasing Quantities of Manufacturers' Materials an Important Feature of Our Foreign Trade, Whereby Additional Employment Is Assured.

The bureau of statistics' records for pary of this year show that manu-urers' materials formed one-half of total imports during that month nd about 46 per cent of the imports or the seven months ended January. For the seven months of this fiscal year exports of manufactures were \$302,000,000, against \$250,000,000 for the preceding shiftar months, an increase of \$52,000,000. In January, 1905, alone the finerense was \$2,000,000. These increases in manufactures exported prove the assertion that all concerned benefit by the increase in manufacturers' materials imported. It is also worth while noting the lines in which this imported material increase has chiefly occurred. Raw silk in January, 1905, was \$5,637,000, an increase over January, 1904, of \$1,800,600; wool, 25,000,000 against 10,000,000 pounds; India rubber, \$26,447,000 against \$20,800,000, an increase of \$55,557,000; hides, \$34,439,000 against \$27.


