Prof. C. M. Bender was obliged to close his school at Laquia, last week owing to some cases of scarlet fever among the children.

The Rev. Dr. Buxton, returned Monday evening from Columbia, Pa. where he has been conducting services in St. Paul's church. The regular services will be held here next Sunday in St. John's church at 7:30 P. M. and at Eagles Mere at 11:00 A. M.

Dr. Buxton, tells us that Columbia is a very beautiful town with 14,000 people, 16 churches, 5 fire companies and no policeman.

Ernest V. Randall of town, lanced the leg in four places below the knee and reopened the wound. A train-nurse is caring for him, and at this time (Thursday morning) his condition is somewhat better.

After having secured a charter for the erection of the Eikinton hospital the charter members met and according to the consensus of opinion among the members present the charter should be placed under the care of the State Board of Charities to the end that state aid may be secured. 
