After July 1st, for a period of six months, all postmasters will be required to weigh all out going mails. In order to do this, patrons of the local office will be requested to deposit mail at least ten minutes before the regular time.

An examination for admission of students to the Forest Academy, at Mont. Alto, Pa. will be held in the Harrisburg High School Building, on Wednesday and Thursday, July 10 and 11. The first day will be devoted to physical examinations and the second to examinations in scholarship.

Candidates for examination must be 18 years of age and not over 25 years by that date. The examinations will be of reasonable difficulty and conducted in the following common school branches; Reading, writing, spelling, arithmetic, algebra, grammar, physiology, geography, United States history and civil government.

A bond will be required of each appointee, conditioned for the faithful carrying out of the terms of his contract with the State. For blank applications or further particulars address the Commissioner of Forestry Harrisburg.

The bill appropriating \$50,000 for two years towards the aiding county fair associations, which was framed and introduced by the Hon. Edgar R. Kiess was signed by Governor Stuart last week. The Hughesville Fair association will be benefited to the extent of \$500 per year by this appropriation. This fair has been succeeding from year to year, but some times experienced hard times and struggled to exist. This appropriation will be of great benefit to the association. The bill provides that each association shall raise an amount equal to its share of the appropriation in order to obtain it.
