**Treasurer's Sale of Unseated
Lands.**

Agreeable to the provision of an Act of Assem-
bly entitled, "An Act directing the mode of sell-
ing Unseated Lands for taxes," passed the 20th
day of March, 1815, and the supplements thereto,
I, Frank H. Farrell, Treasurer of the County of
Sullivan, hereby give notice to all persons con-
cerned, that unless the County, Road, Poor and
School Taxes due on the following tracts of Un-
seated Lands situated in said county are paid be-
fore the day of sale, the whole or such part of
each tract as will pay the taxes and such costs
chargeable thereon will be sold at the Court
House in Laporte, said County of Sullivan, on
the 6th day of June, 1908, being the second Mon-
day in June. The sale to be continued by ad-
judgment from day to day if deemed necessary
for arrears of taxes due, and assessed and
cost accrued on each tract respectively.
