struck her forehead inflicting a

The lake at the top of the Alle-  
ghenies, beautiful Eagles' Mere, will  
soon be giving the "call to the wild"  
to the hundreds who annually visit  
or sojourn at the famous Sullivan  
county resort. In a few weeks the  
summer train service to Eagles  
Mere is expected to start.

E. S. Fenner, of Franklin, who  
was a Civil war veteran, on Sat-  
urday received a check from the  
war department for \$3.78 with a  
note explaining that it was due  
him since November 1861, his pay  
for that month for some reason  
having been short that amount.

The Elk Tanning Company, own-  
ing and operating the tannery at  
Powell, will have to pay \$6,000 to  
M. M. McKee, administrator of the  
estate of the late Elijah Gilbert, who  
died from the effects of scalding re-  
ceived by falling into a vat of hot  
liquor in the tannery on December  
10, 1905. The Supreme court affir-  
med the opinion of the Bradford  
county Court. It was a closely tried  
case.

At a meeting of the Republican  
county committee held at Laporte  
Saturday, the name of M. F. H. Mc  
Carty was withdrawn from the lo-  
cal ticket for the office of County  
Commissioner and Mr. Wm. H.  
Rogers of Laporte was unanimously  
accepted to fill the vacancy. Mr.  
Rogers is a man eminently qualified  
for this office and is well known to a  
majority of tax payers of Sullivan  
county. The committee chose wisely  
selecting him to assume the re-  
sponsibility of a victorious battle at  
the polls next November.

The saw mill of W. J. McCarney  
located between Laporte and Forks  
ville was destroyed by fire Friday  
night of last week and was not dis-  
covered until the mill floor was all  
in flames. The origin of the fire is  
unknown as the mill had been care-  
fully inspected by the foreman a  
half hour before the fire was dis-  
covered. The mill and all its con-  
tents was destroyed including a com-  
plete equipment of machinery for  
manufacturing broom handles owned  
by Charles L. Wing on which no in-  
surance was carried. The mill prop-  
erty was insured for \$1500. The fire  
was prevented from reaching the  
lumber yard and only a small quan-  
tity of lumber was consumed. It is  
reported that the mill will be re-  
built in the near future.
