Removed 1097 Articles From Woman's Stomach
Sacramento, Cal., May 24. - An official report of an operation performed upon Miss Letitia Miller, of San Rafael, for the removal of, 1097 articles, mostly metal from her stomach, says she is on the road to recovery.
The report was filed with the state board of control. These articles were removed: One hundred and eight wire hair pins; 55 open safety pins, 21 broken pins, 5 prunepits, 23 buttons, three collar buttons, 13 nails, three screw eyes, 40 tacks, one staple an inch long, five parts of teapoons, 425 broxen pieces of hair pins, one piece of string, one piece of thread, 104 unidentified odds and ends, mostly metal; nine parts of combs, and 280 small pins.
