Miss Ettie Arnold, of Indian Hill, about two miles from Towanda, committed suicide Sunday by jumping in the Susquehanna river near her home. Her brother, George Arnold, ran all the way from home, reached his sister and pulled her to shore before death had come, but was unable to resuscitate her. Miss Arnold was about forty years of age and has been in poor health for some time, being melancholy at times. Coroner Johnson of Towanda, was notified and went to the scene of the tragedy and made an investigation.
