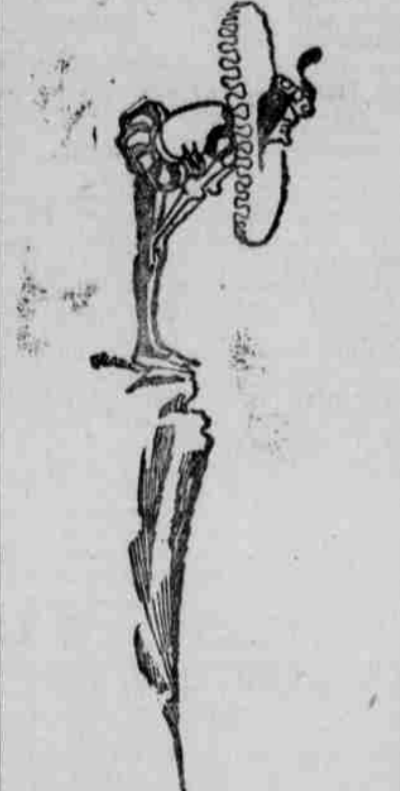

MILTON RELICS AT HARVARD

Signature in an Autograph Album and the Poet's Copy of "Paradise Lost." The Harvard library numbers among its treasures an autograph of Milton.

The "Paradise Lost" is dated 1629 and was doubtless used by Milton during his stay at Cambridge university. At the end he has added an alphabetical index in manuscript, occupying two closely written pages of all the authors cited in his notes.

Milton's autograph is found in the pages of an autograph album or visitor's book kept according to a custom common in the sixteenth century.

The most notable Milton manuscript known to exist is a little book now owned by Trinity College, Cambridge, England, which contains the poet's copies of his so-called minor poems.
