Thus Mr. Jewett labored till the fall of 1884. The last record of his labors is under date of Nov. 2, 1884, and is as follows: "Mr. to the West.

The Rev. Leander Kerr commenced his labors in the Stone, or White church as the successor of Mr. Jewett on Jan. 31, 1836, and continued to be the regular minister till Dec. 14, 1840, when he resigned to acept the appointment of Chaplain in the U.S. army and was assigned to duty at one of the frontier posts.
