Every person excepting Justice of the Pence, who shall hold any office or appointment of the United States or of the State, or of any eity or incorporated district, whether a commission ed officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or sarent, who is, or shall be, employed under the estistative, executive or judiciary department of this State or of the United States, or of any eity or incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and of the State Legisla-ture, and of the select or common cound! of any eity, or sommissioners of any incorporated district, is by law imagehte of holding or exer-bility, at the same time, the office or appoint-ment of Judge. Inspector or Clerk of any elec-lon of this Common wealth; and no Inspector, Judge, or other officer of any such election, shall be eligible to any officer.

QUALIFICATIONS OF VOTERS.

QUALIFICATIONS OF VOTERS. Every male diliaes twenty-one years of age possessing the following qualifications, shall be introduced to vote at all elections. First, he shall have been a dilizenoi the United States at least one month. Second, he shall have resided in the State one year (or if having previously been a qualified elector or native horn dilizen of the State, he shall have removed therefrom and returned then air months) immediately preced-ing the election. Third, He shall have resided in the election. Third, He shall have resided in the election. Fourth, if twenty-two years of age or upwards he shall have paid within two years a State or County tar, which shall have heen assessed at least two months and paid at least one month before the election.— State Constitution. Article VIII, Section 1.
