What is the Sunday School?

The Sunday school is a modern name for an ancient, apostolic service of the church. In other words, it is a Bible school on Sundays. It is a school for "disciples." It is a school with Jesus, for men women and children to gather each Sunday with their Bibles as the text book, to learn about Jesus the Master and lessons of love. The "Master" with his "disciples" about him on the shore of the Sea of Galilee, on the Mount of Olives, in the desert in the temple, or in the synagogue in the upper room—that was Sunday school in the first century.—The teaching of that time was not wholly different from the teaching of to-day. It was a school for questions and answers, for conversations, illustration and application. The "Master" of this first school did not often, I imagine, preach a sermon—an occasional lecture but, probably, more often an answer to a question from a disciple regarding the meaning of certain things in the Old Testament, or concerning the mysteries of the new kingdom. The Sunday school of to-day meets only on Sunday. Not so in those days; for, then, all days were sacred, and every hour laden with opportunity to learn from the great teacher, Jesus Christ. There were times, of course, when Christ worshipped according to the established custom of the temple or synagogue. There were times when he preached to the multitude before him, and times when he chose for his themes the law, the prophets, the soul, the Father, the future—taking his illustrations from life and nature. His best teaching, however, was done in the informal way of conversation when men sought Him to inquire concerning the things of the kingdom, or when, perchance, he had an opportunity, as at Jacob's well or on the way to Emmaus, to speak of the deeper, personal truths of His mission. In the catechetical confidential interviews, so full of questions and answers—so suggestive of eagerness on the part of the taught to learn the truth, and the act on the part of the teacher, we see clearly the germ and the idea of the Sunday school of the early church. This idea has been revived from time to time through all the centuries until we have the Sunday school of to-day. Given an open Bible, an earnest believer and teacher, and we have the essentials of the early Sunday school yet to-day. Some claim that the Sunday school had its name and origin in Robert Raikes, but it has existed since Christ taught the lawyers and doctors. And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up; and as his custom was he went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day and stood up for to read. And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when he had opened the book he found the place where it was written: The spirit of the Lord is upon me because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the broken-hearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, to preach the acceptable year of the Lord. And he closed the book and he gave it again to the minister and sat down. Luke 6: 16-20. And all thy children shall be taught of the Lord, and great shall be the peace of thy children. Isa. 56: 13. Then will I teach transgressors thy way; and sinners shall be converted unto thee. Psalm 51: 13. And that they may teach their children. Deut. 6: 10. Come, ye children, hearken unto me: I will teach you the fear of the Lord.—Psalm 34: 11. I will teach you the good and the right way. I Sam. 12: 23. Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it.—Proverbs 22: 6. Ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath, but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.—Christian dispensation, Eph. 6: 4. Here we have Christ, Solomon and Paul representing the work of the Sunday school. And Paul as his manner was, went in unto them and three Sabbath days reasoned with them out of the scriptures. Acts 17: 2. Those who love to build each other up by the usual processes of edifica-

tion, the interchange, elucidation and application of truth, desire also to help the unenlightened, that they, too, may know the Word of the Lord. The true Christian is ever seeking for souls searching for inquirers, and endeavoring to awaken the indifferent, and the Sunday school made up of such individuals will be characterized by the same spirit. The foundation of Christian character lies in a knowledge of the Master's will and that will is His Testament—the scriptures.

The man or woman can be an efficient worker in the church only in proportion as the days of youth were spent in the Sunday school. The Sunday school is a preparatory school, imparting Bible knowledge and giving lessons of truth which, in after years, are to be fused by the power of the spirit and converted into living, throbbing energies of character. Beyond the limits of the church, beyond the homes of believers, and beyond the bounds even of Christian civilization, are neglected millions to whom the very alphabet of religion is an unknown thing, and familiar quotations from Holy Writ a strange tongue. What a work to be done! Children neglected by parents and pastors, and ungodly men and children growing up here in Christian America in absolute ignorance, as far as the Bible and Christianity is concerned,—for all shall know me, from the least to the greatest. Heb. 8: 11. Little innocent feet patter about on the steps of stately cathedral, not knowing save in senseless profanity, the name of the God to whom it is dedicated. Heathen crowds, indeed, in the very centers of Christian civilization. Let the Sunday school open the door, and the Bible teacher enter. It is the duty of every father and mother on Sunday morning to take their children to Sunday school or see that they are in the Sunday school. Jesus, the great head of the church, said, Suffer little children, and forbid them not, to come unto me: for of such is the kingdom of heaven.

Hannah gave her son Samuel to the Lord. How many homes to-day has God blessed with bright little boys and girls to make the hearts of the parents happy. We see their smiles and hear their little steps across the floor as they speak to us as if to say, "Father, mother, give me a religious training that I may be like Jesus and follow him, and go to church, Sunday school, and do something for Jesus; that my heart may be prepared while young for Jesus to live in."

The Sunday school is a part of the church of Christ, for there were children when Jesus was on earth. He said, Except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. Matt. 18: 3. In I John 2: 1 the apostle speaks of "My little children, I write unto you." Man is a free moral agent, capable of choosing for himself; therefore, if the young mind is trained in the Sunday school in the Bible about Christ, it will grow up and choose to serve Christ instead of the Evil One. The Sunday school ideal is three fold in its nature.—The spirit should prevail in every Sunday school. It should stand for the promotion of the Divine life. And this every Sunday school is an organization for the communication of truth to the ignorant, the young and the susceptible to whom this world is fascinating and leading on.

The Sunday school is a preparatory institution in which we receive systematic training in the letter of the law of God. Christ said, Go, teach all nations. The gospel must be carried beyond the present reach of the pulpit, church service, pastor or church society. Even to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. The ignorant and the prejudiced must be taught. The ground must be broken and the field prepared for the final millennial harvest, and in this great work the Sunday school must do her part. "Go out into the highways and hedges and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled." Luke 14: 23.
