May Infect This Country.

The general apprehension that unknown and dreaded disease, parasites, may be brought to the United States by soldiers who serve in the Philippines has suggested a careful examination of the army patients sent to St. Elizabeth's insane asylum, near Washington, D. C. For several months there has been in progress an inquiry into the subject of parasitic intestinal symptoms, and 500 separate- microscopical examinations have been made at the hygienic laboratory of the public health service.
