[The following is a full copy of the act passed in 1867 and amended in 1868 relative to the collection of school tax in this county, as copied from the pamphlet laws.—Ed.]

parasites were present, making a total of seventy-eight infections. Fifty-nine men were examined who had returned from service in the Philippines; twenty-five of these were affected.

SECTION 2. That it shall be the duty of the treasurer of the different school boards of said county, after they shall receive the duplicates of the assessment from the county commissioners, as hereinbefore provided, to give at least thirty days' written, or printed, notice, in at least three public places in his school district, or borough, of the time and place at which he will attend, in his township, or borough, for the purpose of collecting and receiving school taxes.

SECTION 3. In case any school tax, assessed in any school district, or borough, within the said county, shall remain unpaid for a period of thirty days from and after the first of October aforesaid, it shall be the duty of the treasurer to issue his warrant, under his hand, accompanied by a schedule of all such unpaid taxes, and the names of the persons, respectively, to whom the same are charged, in the proper duplicate, directed to the constable of the proper township, or borough, whose duty it is hereby made to receive the same, authorizing and requiring him to demand and receive, from the persons named in the schedule, the sums with which they are charged, respectively, with an addition of five per centum added thereto, and that the said additional five per centum shall be retained by the constable so collecting, for his own use and benefit, as compensation for collecting taxes aforesaid.
