snowed on Forty-Seven Days.

Mr. Editor.—I see in the "News" of April 12th, that Miss Lavina Long has been keeping account of the snows that we had this winter. She missed some. She said it snowed on the 2nd of January. There was no snow on that day. It was warm and cloudy in the morning, and many farmers got out their plows and ploughed all day. The sun shined in the afternoon, but clouded up after sunset and commenced to rain, and rained until eight o'clock on the morning of the 3d, then turned to snow and snowed all day and drifted considerably. Snow fell on forty-seven days, viz., November 13, 25, 26, 27; December 3, 5, 10, 12, 13, 17, 19, 21, 24, 25; January 3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 11, 13, 14, 23, 24, 25, 28, 29; February 1, 5, 8, 12, 15, 17, 20, 22, 23, 28; March 1, 4, 7, 14; April 6, 7, 8, 16, 17, 18.

The last snow we had in the spring of 1904, was on the 20th of April. I have kept a diary the last fifteen years and keep a daily record of the weather.
