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Look For Them.

An early riser can enjoy the magnificent spectacle of the two most lustrous planets, Venus and Jupiter, showing as morning stars and being in close conjunction. It is impossible to confound these two planets with any other celestial objects. The rise between 1 and 2 o'clock in the morning, Jupiter about half an hour sooner than Venus, and emit their brilliant light until the morning twilight is far advanced. Even the full moon cannot quench their lustre. The best time to view these two brilliant planets is about 3 o'clock, at which time they are high up in the heavens and the skies are not yet irradiated by the lights of the aurora. The planets are now, and will be for a short time, within about 6 degrees of each other.
