WILL BE DRY.
Weather Man Says September and Fall Will Have Little Precipitation.

September will, in all probability, be an unusually dry month, according to the director of the Baltimore weather bureau. In fact, the director predicts a dry fall, basing this on the excessive rainfall of the past three months, which, in Baltimore, amounted to 19.10 inches, greater than during any similar period since 1870, when 22.58 inches fell.

The director attributes the great rainfall of June, July and August to the unusually low barometric pressures and the constant southerly breeze which brings an abundance of moisture from the Atlantic ocean.

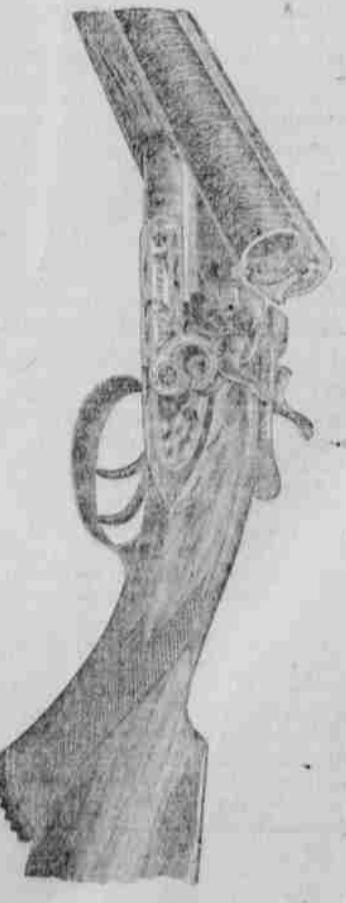
