Letter to Harvey Unger, McConnellsburg, Pa.

Dear Sir: A pound of good meat and no bone is worth more than a half pound of meat and a half pound of bone; but there are, as you say, a great many people who won't pay more than a certain price by the pound.

There are people who won't pay more than \$1.50 a gallon for paint; give 'em bone!

There's no better school than experience; cost is high; but the lesson is never forgotten.

Let a man paint two houses alike, same size; one Devoe, the other that \$1.50 paint. He buys 10 gallons of each, and pays \$3 a day for labor—\$8 a day is \$3 a gallon, easier reckoning.

He has to buy two gallons more of the \$1.50 paint; and has two gallons left of Devoe; 12 gallons \$1.50, \$18; 8 gallons \$1.75, \$14; \$4 more for "cheap" paint.

He pays \$8 a gallon for painting; 8 gallons \$64; 12 gallons \$96; \$12 more for painting "cheap" paint.

He'll buy the less-gallons paint after that. If people are slow to learn, it's because they keep on buying bone-meat. Give 'em plenty of bone.

PROCLAMATION GENERAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, in and by an act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An act relating to the election within the Commonwealth," passed the 19th day of June, Anno Domini 1891, and amended the 28th day of June Anno Domini 1902, it is made the duty of the Sheriff of every county within the Commonwealth to give public notice of the general elections and in such notices to enumerate the officers to be elected and give a list of all the nominations made, and designate the places at which the election is to be held.

THEREFORE, I, JAMES G. ALEXANDER, High Sheriff of the county of Fulton, do hereby make known and give public notice to the Electors of the county of Fulton, that on

The First Tuesday after the First Monday of November next, being the 6th day of the month

A General Election will be held at the several Election Places established by law in said County, and as published below.
