WHEREAS, in and by an act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled, "An Act relating to the election within the Commonwealth," passed the 13th day of June, Anno Domini 1897, and amended the 2nd day of June Anno Domini 1904, it is made the duty of the Sheriff of every county within the Commonwealth to give public notice of the General Election and in such notice to enumerate the officers to be elected and give a list of the nominations made, and designate the place at which the election is to be held.
