**One Cent Postage Stamps.**

Beginning about March 1, 1907, the postoffice department will issue one cent postage stamps in book form. There will be only one size, containing twenty-four one-cent stamps in four sheets of six stamps each, interleaved with perforated paper and bound like the books of two cent stamps. The selling price will be twenty-five cents per book.
