dispatch to the Bos'on Trans-

eight years ago were worth only
\$40, are now selling at \$200 to
\$300 each; a good team is worth
\$500. These horses are needed
in the lumber woods and on rail-
way construction, but not enough
can be had. Men to work in the
woods are being paid \$70 a month
and board. A man with a good
team commands wages of \$9 a
day hauling lumber and logs.
Never have the wages been so
high or the prices of horses so
great as now.


