Household Notes.

To prevent hands from getting cold while hanging up clothes, wipe hands dry and rub thoroughly with powdered starch.

Cut an Irish potato in half, dip one of the pieces in the brick dust which is generally used for cleaning knives.

An easy way to soften hard water is to throw orange peel into it just before the water is used.
