Of the \$1,476,273 embezzled in this State in 1907, \$446,081, or thir-

ty-two per cent., was traced to the fat and bulging satchess of the book-makers, and the facts as to many of the individual embezzlements are lacking. These doubtless would increase the amount of stealing due to gambling on horse races.






