\$162,000,000 For Pensions.
Washington, April 20.—The Senate Committee on Pensions on Monday practically completed consideration of the pension appropriation bill. It will carry about \$162,000,000, an increase of \$12,000,000 over the House bill, having been made to carry out the provisions of the widows' pension bill, which has been enacted.

The House bill was amended so as to eliminate the provision for abolishing pension agencies throughout the country and consolidating the work of the agencies under the bureau in this city.
