**FERTILITY OF SOIL.**  
Science of the Growth of Plants Should Be Understood by Farmer.  
A. R. Whitson of the Wisconsin station says: Directly or indirectly the food of mankind comes from the soil, and there is, therefore, nothing more important in agriculture than that the factors which determine the productivity of the soil be thoroughly understood. This bulletin is written for the purpose of putting before the farmer a statement of our present knowledge of the factors which influence the fertility of the soil and of the relation of these factors to each other. The agricultural plants require for growth a favorable temperature, light, and a supply of material including carbon dioxide, water and certain chemical elements derived from the soil. The chief of these elements are nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium, calcium and magnesium. Since oxygen is used at every point of the plant where growth takes place, it is needed at the tops of the roots, and therefore soil must be aerated. All these conditions are dependent on the climate, on the physical and chemical conditions of the soil, and on various changes going on in the soil.
