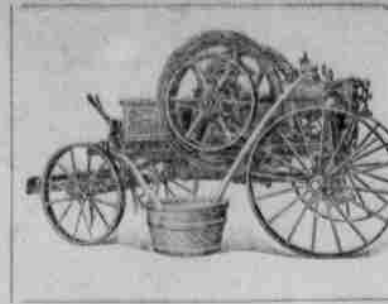
Rev. Dr. West will preach in the Presbyterian Church at Green Hill on next Sabbath morning and at this place in the evening.
