A million robins were killed in Louisiana during the winter of 1907-8, the offenders being men and boys who shot them for food. While they are protected as song birds in Northern States, it is a common Southern practice to shoot them for the table, and in some States the hunters kill them in great numbers at their roosting-places. A government expert suggests that the eastward movement of the boll weevil has been facilitated by the killing of the robins.
