While the amount expended for barrels can be quite closely estimated for a given year, it is not possible to say how many barrels are in actual use. The

life of a barrel is put down at one year by the trade, but this is far from true. A majority of parrels are used many times. They begin as sugar and flour barrels, and are then sold to the farmer for shipping his produce to the market. It may be that they are returned to him several times carrying potatoes to the market on the first trip and tobacco or lettuce on the next, each cargo being lighter in weight than the previous one, owing to the weak, ened condition of the barrel. Finally, the barrel may serve out its lifework as a refuse receptacle, and in the end can be used for fuel
