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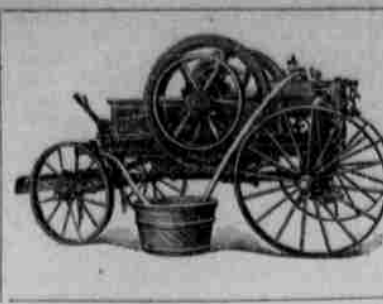

**Dog Tax Law Unconstitutional**  
In a bill in equity recently filed in the Lebanon court the constitutionality of the Act of Assembly approved May 25, 1893, and its supplement approved June 1, 1897, is attacked by Titus M. Gass, president of the dog tax association of Jackson township, that county. The act is declared to be unconstitutional for the following reasons: "Because the title of the act contains more than one subject, being for the taxation of dogs and the protection of sheep and does not fairly give notice of its contents; because the tax provided for is not uniform upon the same class of subjects and because the power given to the tax collector, constable or citizen of any district to kill the dog of any person not paying the dog tax provided by the act is contemptuous legislation and the tax is confiscatory."
