NEWS OF PENNSYLVANIA

MADMAN IN CHURCH.
Bible Student Overstudies and Trics to Preach.
Reading.—Great excitement prevailed at the Salem United Brethren Church, when a demented man, breaking into the place, preached a sermon to an imaginary audience. Rev. S. B. Wegger, the pastor, residing in the parsonage adjoining the church, and while seated at the breakfast table heard the crash of falling glass.

Great was his surprise when he saw in the pulpit a young man, whom he recognized as Harry X. Rowe, a member of his congregation. Rowe was bare-footed and his trousers were rolled up above his knees. In one hand he carried an immense butcher knife, and persons who were attracted to the place through the commotion were afraid to venture near him. The police were notified and Rowe was taken into custody after some difficulty.

Rowe is a close student of the Bible, and it is said that his mind has become affected through overstudy.

JAIL READING PRAECHEE.
Prominent Politician Convicted of Keeping Disorderly House.
Reading.—William D. Thompson, a former well-known Republican leader of this city, who served several terms in Select Councils, and who upon two occasions was defeated for the Republican nomination for Mayor, was found guilty before Judge Stevens of the charge of maintaining a disorderly house at his home. Witnesses testified that young men and women congregated there for liquor and raised a general disturbance.

He was sentenced to pay a fine of \$50, the costs and to undergo a term of six months in prison. Thompson is 70 years old, a Civil War veteran and is well-known as a local preacher.

WELCOMES PRISON TERM.
Burglar Caught at Reading Claims This City As Home.
Reading.—Arrested at the home of Mrs. Emma R. Rick, a wealthy widow, a burglar who says he is Harry Willard, of 625 North Seventh Street, Philadelphia, was sentenced to five years at hard labor in the Eastern Penitentiary. Willard says he is a morphine fiend and that his attempt to rob the Rick residence was his first offense. He expressed pleasure at being sent to prison, saying he hoped to become cured of the drug habit while confined.

CUT IN STEEL WAGES.
Cambria Company's Ten Per Cent. Reduction Affects 18,000 Men.
Johnstown.—The Cambria Steel Company, which when in full activity employs 18,000 men, announced a 10 per cent. reduction in wages to take effect April 1.

The reduction will affect all employees from the highest to the lowest.

Non-Suited in Slander Case.
Norristown.—Mrs. James Eshbach and her husband were non-suited in their trial for \$5000 damages against Burgess Hiram Culler, of Pottsville, for slander and defamation of character. According to Judge Weand, the burgess had made the allegations without malice in the course of a judicial proceeding.

Killed by Falling Slate.
Pine Grove.—William Lehr, a miner, of Pine Grove Township, 38 years old, employed at robbing pillars at the Philadelphia & Reading Coal and Iron Company's Lincoln Colliery, was killed by a fall of top slate. A widow and four children survive him.

Well Known Mason Drops Dead.
Cottsville.—J. Howard Coates, 31 years, chief of Washington Fire Company, No. 1, prominent in Masonic and Knight Templar circles, dropped dead here while returning to his home. He was secretary and draughtsman for Hon. W. A. P. Thompson.

11-Year-Old Girl Killed by Express.
Reading.—Edna, the 11-year-old daughter of Mrs. Ellen Wentzel, of Frush Valley, this county, was struck by an express train on the East Penn branch of the Reading Railroad. She was hurled a distance of forty-five feet and was instantly killed.

Mahanoy Tries Extinguisher.
Mahanoy City.—The fire which broke out at midnight at Bear Run and Maple Hill mines, of the Philadelphia & Reading Coal & Iron Company, from unknown causes, has been extinguished. Several hundred employees under the direction of Division Superintendent Pollard and District Superintendent McDonald, aided in fighting the flames.

SUES HER MOTHER-IN-LAW.
Altoona.—Mrs. Catherine Minzenberg brought suit against her mother-in-law Mrs. Amelia Minzenberg, of Altoona, for \$25,000 damages for alienating the affections of her husband.

She says in her statement that she was married in New York, June 8, 1908, and lived happily with her husband until January 5 last, when his mother persuaded him to desert her.

Think Less Met Foul Play.
York.—That Albert Leas, whose body was found in a barn on his brother-in-law's farm near Hollans, met with foul play, is indicated by a further investigation by the authorities. The theory of suicide was exploded at a post-mortem, it being revealed that Leas met his death by heart trouble, hastened by a blow on the head. A thick salve had been smeared on the dead man's face when his body was discovered. It is the opinion of the authorities that the salve was placed on the injured nose and forehead in order to relieve the suffering of the injured man.
