State Zoologist Surface reports that he is receiving communications from all parts of the State of Pennsylvania of the unusual outbreak of Aphids, or Plant Lice this year.

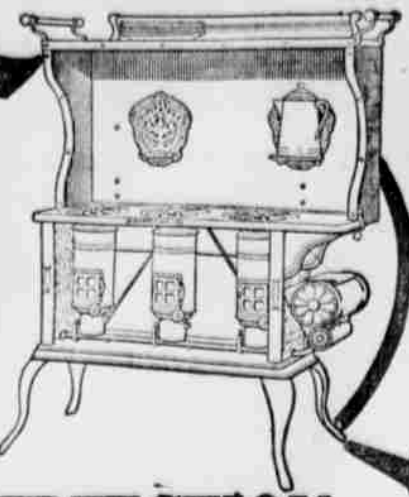
The Plant Lice are to be killed by spraying at the right time, which means shortly after the buds burst or before the leaves have curled.

The Apple Aphid is by far the most commonly reported pest at this time of year. However, it has reached its worst and will soon be leaving the apple leaves to migrate to the roots of grasses and grains.
