**FRESH AIR LIFE IDEA IS GROWING.**

Dr. Dixon's Suggestions Are Being Followed Widely—Good Work Is Done.

The gospel of fresh air is being successfully taught by State Health Commissioner Dixon's dispensaries for tuberculosis throughout Pennsylvania. Windows wide open in the sleeping rooms, and wherever possible a bed right out in the open air, is one of the weapons tuberculosis patients are being taught to use in their fight for health.

The state department of health has now 114 tuberculosis dispensaries in Pennsylvania, two new ones having been opened at Nanticoke in Luzerne county, and at Brownsville in Fayette county. At the present time over 11,000 tuberculosis patients are being treated at these dispensaries and trained nurses are visiting the homes of these patients, teaching them how to care for themselves, and instructing the other members of the household how to guard against infection.

For the month ending October 20 last, 10,335 such visits to the homes of patients were made by department of health nurses, and for the ten months ending October 20, 76,794 visits were made. During these same ten months, 471 patients were discharged from the dispensaries with the disease arrested, a most encouraging record.

It has been decided by the postoffice department that the words "Not to be opened until Christmas day," or similar inscriptions, may be written only on such parcels as bear postage at first class rates; but packages that are mailed at third-class or fourth class rates may bear the same inscription provided that it is printed or stamped on them.

When written on the parcel with pen or pencil the words are held to be a personal communication from the sender to the addressee, thus making the matter subject to first class rates.
