Should Not Cost More Than Fifteen or Sixteen Dollars.

The Master of a Grange, locat ed in Jefferson county, wrote to Professor H. A. Surface, the State Zoologist, Harrisburg, Pa for information as to the cost of a feet of hose and a ten-foot extension pole, as about the kind of an outfit that the members of his Grange would want. As different members had determined to procure the necessaary apparatus for spraying their trees, the information was requested to be given before the next meeting of

The cost of spraying apparatus is a question which has agitated quite a good many farmers, some of whom have deferred caring for their trees and permitted the San Jose scale to do great damage, because of the idea that an outfit is expensive. The letter of Professor Surface, therefore, in reply to the one received from the Grange, will be of general interest. Following is a copy of the letter:

"Replying to your recent letter, I think you can get a spraying outfit such as you mention, for about fifteen or sixteen dollars. 
