TUESDAY'S ELECTION.

General Democratic Landslide All Over The Country Except in Fulton County.

By reference to the table published elsewhere, a result of the vote in the county will be seen, and it will be noted that Tener the Republican candidate for governor, carried the county by a plurality of 76 votes over Grim. For the legislature, Clarence E. Akers, Republican, of Brush Creek, defeated his opponent, ex-County Superintendent Clem Chestnut, by a majority of 87.

In the State, John K. Tener, the Republican candidate for governor, was elected by a plurality of less than 20,000, over his closest competitor, W. H. Berry. The Democrats won all over the United States where a fight, of any consequence was on and they will surely dominate the next Congress.

Democratic governors were elected in New York, Ohio, New Jersey, Connecticut, Massachusetts, and many other States for merly strongholds of the republic party.

This is accounted for to a great extent by the general unrest of the people during the past year, and to the unprecedented high cost of living.
