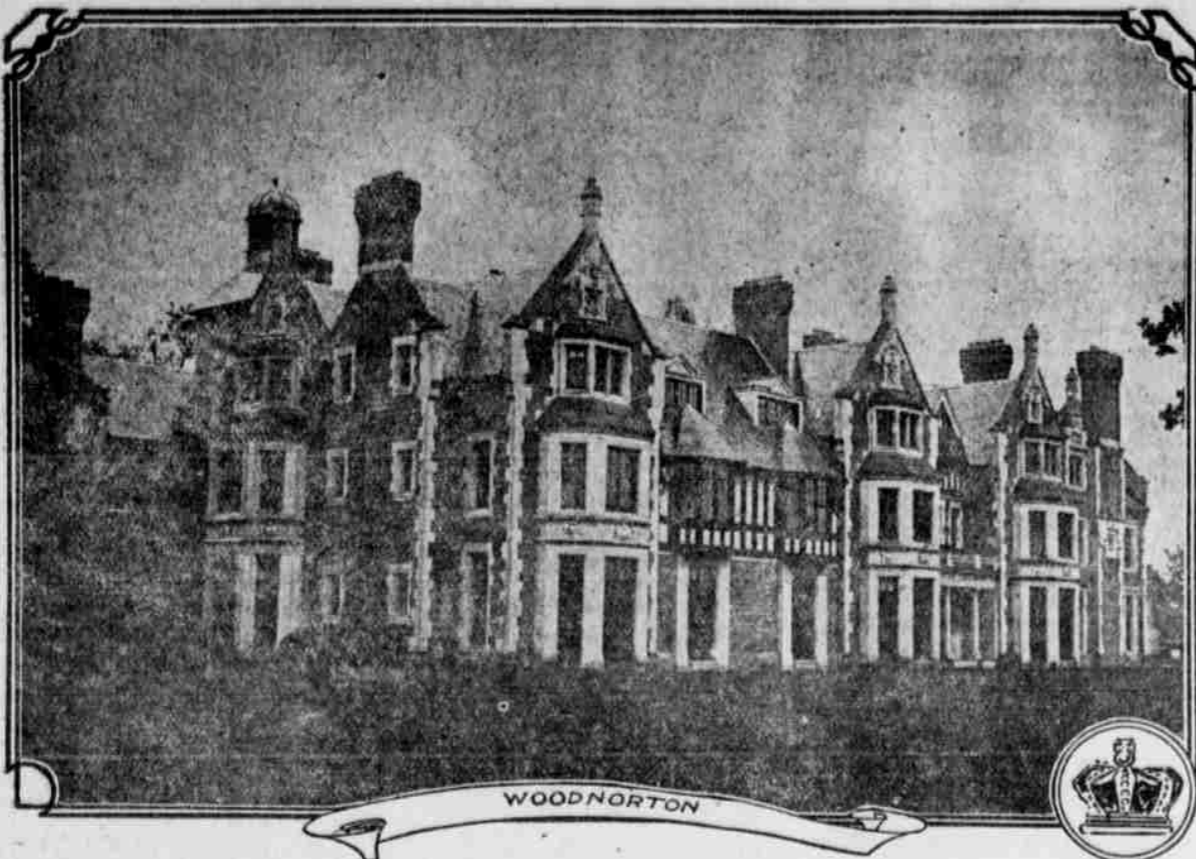

BARS SALE BIRDS' PLUMAGE

Aigrettes Cannot Be Sold by New York Milliners After July 1 Next by Statute.

New York.—The plumage of forty-three specimens of birds formerly used to decorate women's hats cannot be sold by the milliners of New York state after July 1 next, according to the annual report of the National Association of Audubon Societies.

The most important feature of a law recently passed by the state legislature, the report continues, is the prohibition of the sale of aigrettes. New York is one of the three greatest centers for the sale of aigrettes, the others being Paris and London.
