I hereby announce myself as a candidate for the Democratic nomination for the Office of Prothonotary, &c., subject to the next June primaries. I also pledge myself to support the ticket then nominated.

At a meeting down at Fort Loudon a few days ago a new telephone company was organized to be known as the Fort Loudon and Cove Gap Telephone Company. Rights of way have already been secured and the plans made for the immediate building of the line. The line will start at Fort Loudon and continue to Mercersburg by way of Cove Gap and connect at Mercersburg with the Bell telephone line.

Beginning with the new fiscal year Secretary Knox will receive a salary of \$12,000, the same amount paid to the other Cabinet officers. The Secretary was estopped from receiving more than \$8,000 because the compensation of Cabinet officers was increased by Congress to \$12,000 per annum during the term for which he was elected to the United States Senate.
