Look For the Caterpillars.

An exchange urges its readers who may have fruit or ornamental trees to be on the lookout at this time of the year for the tent caterpillar as it is now beginning its destructive work. Trees should be examined every few days and the ravagers destroyed either by cutting off the small twigs on which they have started and throwing them into a fire or by burning them with a torch. If the fight is begun as soon as they makes their appearance and is vigilantly kept up for a short time, they can be conquered, but if left to get much headway they will entirely cover the trees on which they have appeared. The best time to attack them is in the evening when the caterpillars are all in their webs of tents.
