GOD SAVE THE COMMON-WEALTH. PROCLAMATION GENERAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, in and by an act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled, "An act relating to the elections within the Commonwealth," passed the 19th day of June, Anno Domini 1893, and amended the 27th day of June, Anno Domini 1903, it is made the duty of the Sheriff of every county within the Commonwealth to give public notice of the general elections and in such notice to enumerate the officers to be elected and give a list of all the nominations made, and designate the place at which the election is to be held.

THEREFORE, I, JEFFERSON HARRIS, High Sheriff of the county of Fulton, do hereby make known and give this PUBLIC NOTICE to the Electors of the county of Fulton, that on The First Tuesday after the First Monday of November next, being the 7th day of the month

A General Election will be held at the several Election Districts established by law in said County, and as published below.

This is to certify that the following is the official list of the names of all candidates nominated at the Uniform Primary Election held Saturday, September 30, 1911, as tabulated from the returns on file in this office and as certified to this office by the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and also of all candidates nominated by nomination papers filed in this office as provided for by the act of Assembly, for the offices of Associate Judge, Prothonotary, Recorder and Recorder and Clerk of the County, County Commissioners, County Treasurer, Sheriff, District Attorney, and County Auditor. city, borough, township, school district, or other municipality or incorporated district, except as herein provided, shall never exceed seven percent upon the assessed value of the taxable property therein, nor shall any such municipality or district incur any new debt, or increase its indebtedness to an amount exceeding two percent upon such assessed valuation of property, without the assent of the electors thereof at a public election in such manner as shall be provided by law; but any city, the debt of which now exceeds seven percent of such assessed valuation, may be authorized by law to increase the same three per centum, in the aggregate, at any one time, upon such valuation, except that any debt or debts hereinafter incurred by the city and county of Philadelphia for the construction and development of subways for transit purposes, or for the construction of wharves and docks, or the reclamation of land to be used in the construction of a system of wharves and docks, as public improvements, owned or to be owned by said city and county of Philadelphia, and which shall yield to the city and county of Philadelphia current net revenue in excess of the interest on said debt or debts and of the annual installments necessary for the cancellation of said debt or debts, may be excluded in ascertaining the power of the city and county of Philadelphia to become otherwise indebted: Provided, That a sinking fund for their cancellation shall be established and maintained.

Every person excepting Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of the United States or of this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, or any other officer or agent, who is, or shall be, employed under the legislative, executive or judicial department of the State or of any United States or of any city or incorporated district, and also that every member of the Senate and of the State Legislature, or of the select or common council of any city, or commissioners of any incorporated district, or any other officer or agent, shall be ineligible to hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of the United States or of this State, or of any city or incorporated district, or any other officer or agent, until he has held such office or appointment for one year (or, if having previously been a qualified elector or native born citizen of the State, he shall have resided in and returned, then six months) immediately preceding the election. Fourth, He shall have resided in the election district where he shall offer to vote at least two months immediately preceding the election. Fourth, If two years of age or upwards he shall have paid within two years a state or county tax, which shall have been assessed at least two months and paid at least one month before the election.—State Constitution, Article VIII, Section 1.

Proposed Amendment to the Constitution No. 2 Shall Section Six of Article Five of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

Section 6. In the county of Philadelphia all the jurisdiction and powers now vested in the district courts and courts of common pleas, subject to such changes as may be made by this Constitution or by law, shall be in Philadelphia vested in five distinct and separate courts of equal and co-ordinate jurisdiction, composed of three judges each. The said courts in Philadelphia shall be designated respectively as the court of common pleas number one, number two, number three, number four, and number five, but the number of said courts may be by law increased from time to time, and shall be in like manner designated by successive numbers. The number of judges in any of said courts, or in any county where the establishment of an additional court may be authorized by law, may be increased, from time to time, and whenever such increase shall amount in the whole to three, such three judges shall compose a distinct and separate court as aforesaid, which shall be numbered as aforesaid. In Philadelphia all suits shall be instituted in the said courts of common pleas without designating the number of the said court, and the several courts shall distribute and apportion the business among them in such manner as shall be provided by rules of court, and each court, to which any suit shall be thus assigned, shall have exclusive jurisdiction thereof, subject to change of venue, as shall be provided by law.

In the county of Allegheny all the jurisdiction and powers now vested in the several numbered courts of common pleas shall be vested in one court
