UNCLE SAM'S GREAT NAVY SCHOOL OPENED



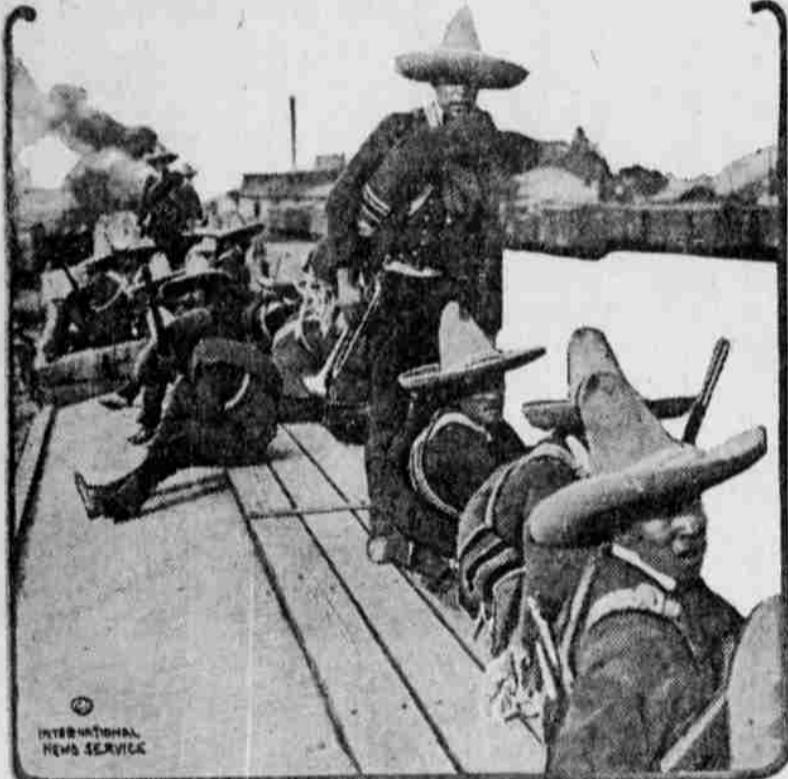

COUNTESS DE BOURTIER



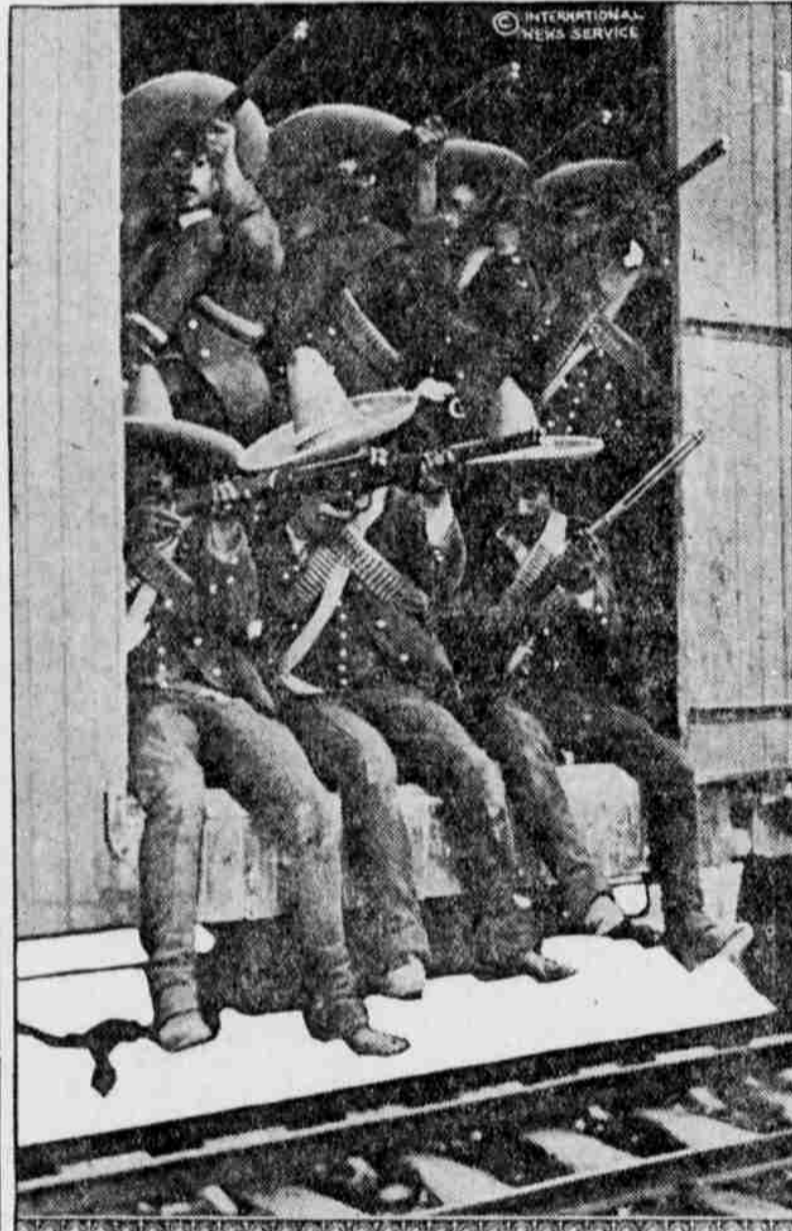

MME. CONSTANTIN DUMBA



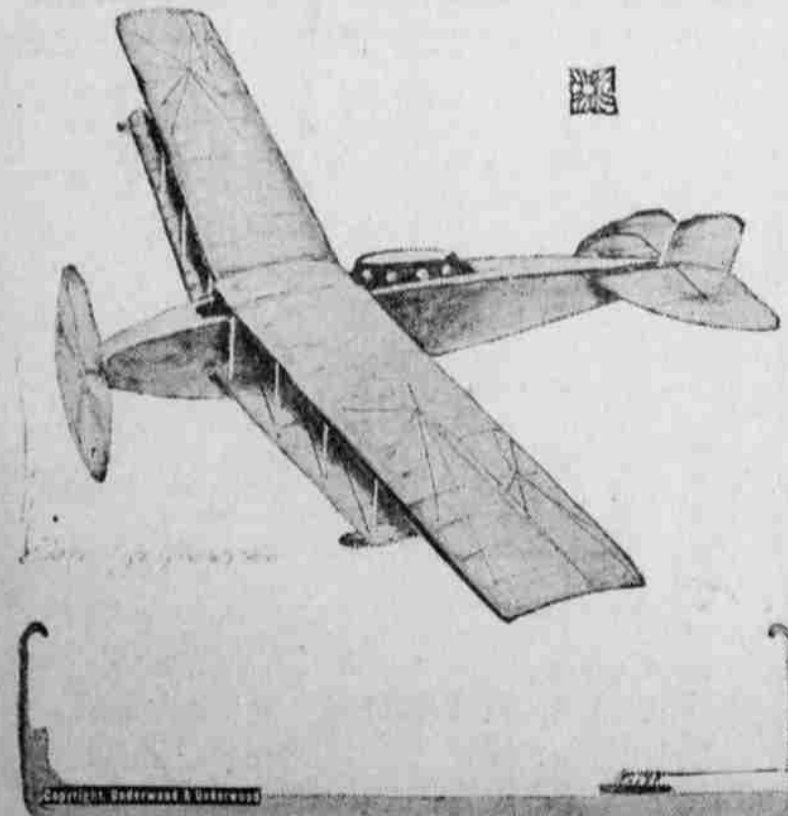
