


FRENCH PATROL BOAT PROTECTS THE AISNE CANAL


AMERICAN LOCOMOTIVE ENGINEERS ON THE JOB IN FRANCE




Here are the new Mexican service budges, which are being distributed to the American veterans of the border brush. On the left is the navy badge, both sides being shown, and on the right the army badge.

## FIRST AMERICAN-BUILT TANK IS BIGGEST YET



The first American-built tank, called the "America," is the biggest ever constructed, and is greatly superior in power to any other. It weighs 45 tons, and is propelled by steam.

This striking photograph shows the plied-up ruins in the business district of San Jacinto, Cal., after the earthtake. Soldiers are patrolling the devastated area to guard against vandals. The shock, which was felt throughout outhern California, did most damage at this spot, where it destroyed more than a third of the city, including almost he entire business section. The neighboring town of Hemet was also severely hit by the earthquake, the damage in the two cities amounting to half a million dollars.


