A CONGRESSMAN'S BULLET.

Philip B. Thompson, Jr., the Republican representative of the Eighth Kentucky district in Congress, shot and instantly killed Walter Davis a grocer at Horribsburg on Saturday morning last while on a train on the Cincinnati Southern Railroad...

"Last December, being called to Washington by the duties growing out of my position, I was accompanied by my wife to Cincinnati, and being anxious to get to Washington as soon as possible I left that city on Monday, the same day of my arrival there, and left her with friends. The next day Mr. Davis, the deceased, came to Cincinnati, and having met her upon the street, registered himself at a hotel and hearing from her and the lady who accompanied her that she was stopping at the St. Clair Hotel, he followed her there, when he registered himself again under an assumed name and took a room. He then took her out, and having plied her with drink against the protest of her friends, until she was utterly besotted, well knowing her infirmity in that regard, continued his application until he carried her to his room, detached her, made her the victim, in her unfortunate condition, of his degraded lust, then turned her out to wander where she would until picked up by the night watchman and carried to her friends. Having accomplished my diabolical, he left the house before breakfast. While I had been informed before of some of the facts relating to her intoxication, and that he was the cause of her public exposure and degradation at the hotel, I did not know the extent of the wrong until on Tuesday night last, as I came home, I was fully informed of the infamy which he had heaped upon her and my family. I do not believe that I will receive the censure of this people, but whatever is the will of the Court I will now bow to and bear with as becomes a good citizen. This has broken up and destroyed my domestic relations, my peace and happiness. My daughter, dearer to me than all else on earth, is an exile from home, an outcast from society. She has sobbed herself to sleep on my bosom under this great calamity, part of which only she knew. This blood is but a feeble atonement for her tears, and if he had a hundred lives all of them would not atone for this great wrong. For the first time this morning I met him, and I feel that I did what every man who has a home which he loves and a daughter dear to him would do, if he has the courage to defend them from the wrong. and feel that I will receive the sympathy of the good and virtuous, and now submit to the action of the Court." Thompson is said to be and expect with the pistol, having killed no less than half a dozen men in self defense. He was a member of Morgans Band during the war, and is said to be very popular with his people. He was released on \$5000 bail.

ON TO FREDERICKSBURG.

THE SOLDIERS OF CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA TO VISIT A GREAT BATTLE-FIELD.

Arrangements have been completed by the Regimental Association of the One Hundred and Thirty-first Pennsylvania Volunteers for a grand excursion to Fredericks, Va., to which Grand Army posts and their friends are invited throughout Central Pennsylvania.

They will go to Washington on May 21st, remain there one day, thence to Fredericksburg, where extensive arrangements for their reception are contemplated by the soldiers and citizens. The return will be by steamer, mainly by daylight, on Friday, by way of the beautiful Rappahannock regions and the Chesapeake bay. The steamer is first class in all its appointments and a general re-union will be held on board. The Pennsylvania Railroad Company will issue card orders in their usual liberal way, on presentation of which, at the following stations, excursion tickets may be purchased to Fredericksburg and return, good going on May 21st to Washington and to Fredericksburg on the 22nd, and return from Baltimore on the 26th, at the rates noted: Lock Haven, \$10.64; Jersey Shore, \$10.10; Williamsport, \$9.60; Milton, \$8.54; Lewisburg, \$8.79; Sunbury, \$8.04; Nanticoke, \$10.30; Wilkesbarre, \$10.58; Harrisburg, \$5.88; Newport, \$9.98; Millin, \$7.24; Lewistown Junction, \$8.31. To these rates must be added \$1.50, the steamer fare from Fredericksburg to Baltimore. Many of the officers and men will take their wives and families with them, and the occasion promises to be one of the memorable events of the summer. Captain J. R. Orwig, of this city, will distribute the card orders, and has charge of the details of the excursion. -Harrisburg Patriot.
