

GREAT EARTHQUAKES.

The following are the net results of loss from the most disastrous earthquakes on record:
1424—Syria, Palestine and Asia, 500 towns destroyed, 113,700 killed, 15,243 persons buried.
1458—In Syria; 20,000 perished.
1268—In Ceilan, 50,000 perished.
1475, December 5—At Naples; 40,000 perished.
1509, September 14—Constantinople; thousands perished.
1531, February 23—At Lisbon; 1,500 houses and 30,000 persons killed.
1626, July 30—Naples, 90 towns and 70,000 lives lost.
1657, April 6—Regusa ruined, 5,000 perished.
1667—Felmaki; lasted 3 months, 80,000 perished.
1672, April 14—At Rimini; above 1,500 perished.
1692, June 7—Island of Jamaica, whole of Port Royal engulfed forty fathoms deep and 3,000 perished.
1693, September—Fifty-four cities and towns and more than 100,000 lives were lost.
1703, February 2—Aquila; 5,000 perished.
1703—Jedo, Japan, ruined; 200,000 perished.
1706, November 3—In the Abruzzi, 15,000 perished.
1716, May and June—At Algiers, 20,000 perished.
1726, September 1—Palermo, 6,000 lives lost.
1732, November 30—China, 100,000 people swallowed up at Peking.
1732, November 29—Naples, 1,941 perished.
1746, October 28—Lima and Callao, 18,000 persons buried.
1751—Grand Carin, half the houses and 40,000 persons swallowed up.
1755, June 7—Karschan, North Persia, destroyed; 40,000 perished.
1755, November 1—The great earthquake at Lisbon. In about eight minutes most of the houses and upward of 50,000 inhabitants were swallowed up.
1759, October 30—Syria; 20,000 perished.
1780—Tauris, 15,000 houses and multitudes buried.
1787, February 4—Panama destroyed and 40,000 people buried in one second.
1806, July 26—Frosolone, Naples, 6,000 lives lost.
1812, March 10—At Caracas, 12,000 perished.
1819, June 16—Kutch sunk, 2,000 persons killed.
1822—Año, if ever, it is now said that 20,000 persons were killed.
1846, February 15—Ternate, thousands lost.
1842, May 7—Capo Haytion, St. Domingo, between 4,000 and 5,000 lives lost.
1851 August 15—South Italy, 14,000 lives lost.
1850, March 2—Island of Great Sanger, 3,000 lives lost.
1859, March 22—Quito, 5,000 persons killed.
1861, March 20—Mendoza, South America, 7,000 lives lost.
1863, July 2 and 3—Manilla, Philippine Isles, 10,000 persons perished.
1868, August 13 and 15—Peru and Ecuador, 20,000 lives lost and 30,000 rendered homeless; loss of property estimated at \$300,000,000.
1875, May 16 and 18—San Jose de Oca, Colombia, 14,000 lives lost.
1881, March 16—Ischia, 283 houses and 114 lives lost. March 4, more destroyed by another shock.
1881, April 3—Scio, 4,000 perished.
1883, July 23—Island of Ischia in the Bay of Naples, destroyed; 1,990 lives lost.
1883, August 26—Java Island was shattered and sunk, and sixteen others raised their heads above the surrounding waters. Nearly 100,000 people were buried beneath volcanic debris or swept off the face of the land by the volcanic wave.
1881-85—Andalusia, 745 persons killed, 1,485 injured, and 17,000 buildings damaged.
1885—Seringar and numerous villages almost destroyed.
1889, August 28—Morea and the Island of Zante, several villages and 200 lives lost.
1880, August 31—Charleston, S. C., about 90 persons killed and property to the amount of \$1,000,000 destroyed.
